Most Treasured Possession Above All | Deuteronomy 7 | Pr. Wallace Ong

1. Consider Deut. 7:1-5. Who or what are our enemies today that threaten our relationship with God? Why is it important to completely destroy these enemies and not compromise with them? How to overcome these enemies? Why do we often feel defeated?
2. Consider Deut. 7:6-11. What does it mean to be God's people? What does it mean to be a "holy people"? How are holy people different from other people?
3. Why does it matter for us to know that God chose us? What is the proper response to God's love for us? How does this passage help us to live our Christian Life?
4. Consider Deut. 7:12-15. As God's holy people in today's culture, what are some of the things Christians need to avoid and why? On the other hand, what are some of the things Christians ought to be doing and why?

5. Consider Deut. 7:16-25. What did God want His people to remember and why? What personal experiences from your past you can lean on as encouragement? How is your faith affected by remembering God's work in the past?

6. What aspects of God's character revealed in Deut. 7 are most impactful as you consider embracing the life God has called you to? How does Deut. 7 strengthen you as you face the realities of the struggles in your life?

7. Prayerfully consider the following questions: As a believer, are you living a distinctive life? How would your life be different this week if you grew in your awareness of being called and set apart by God? What are the things that stand in the way of complete devotion to God that you need to get rid of? What would it look like to turn from them?

Pray for one another:

- Thank God for making you part of his chosen people, a holy nation, and royal priesthood.
- Ask him to help you live distinctively from the world and bring holiness to completion in the fear of God.
- Confess ways that you have not kept yourself unstained from the world.
- Take some time to give thanks in praise and worship God for His love, His faithfulness, His wonderful promises, His ever-presence, and for being a powerful God who is for us and not against us.
