1. According to Matt 6:5-8, as Christians, what is the wrong way to pray? Why? What kind of heart attitudes we should have when we pray?
2. Matt 6:8 - if God knows what we need, why do you think He wants us to pray to Him still?
3. What is prayer? What is the purpose of prayer?
4. Matt 6:9 - To whom is prayer to be addressed to? How has knowing this verse improved your prayer life?
5. How can we hallow God's name? How has knowing this verse improved your prayer life?
6. In your understanding, explain Matt 6:10. How has understand this verse made impact to your prayer life and Christian walk?

7. Matt 6:11 – Do you see that God is the one who provides and gives you all that you have? If yes, how does this perspective make a difference in your life? And if no, please share your thoughts on this verse?

8. In your understanding, explain Matt 6:12. What do you think about this verse? Is there anyone in your life you have not yet forgiven, but need to, so God can forgive you (Matt 6:14-15)? Please share some of your experience.

9. Matt 6:13 – Please share your understanding about this verse? Who is this evil one? Does this verse include satan? Is satan real? Please read Ephesian 6:10-18? 1 Peter 5:8-9.

10. Matt 6:13a - Where do our temptations come from? Please read James 1:13-15.

11. What are the areas that you still struggle with – according to Matthew 6: 5-15? Please share so that cg family can pray for one another.

Pray:

- Pray that our prayer life will follow after the teaching of our Lord Jesus.
- Pray for the areas that you are still struggling with – according to Matt 6: 5-15.
- Pray for God to reveal that person(s) you still have not forgiven, bring to God your past hurt and violation of that person(s). Forgive them and pray for them to come to know God.
- Pray for deliverance in the areas where you still being tempted.
- Pray for deliverance in the areas where you are being oppressed by the evil one.
- Pray the Lord's Prayer, stopping at each phrase and expanding on it to reflect your own prayer from your heart.
