1. If someone sternly shout at you “Don’t judge me!” What does that mean to the you and what does it imply? Matt. 7.1-6

2. What is the meaning of the word “judge”? Does Jesus forbid his followers to judge others “yes” or “No” and why? Matt.1-6

3. Why are the logs more dangerous than the dogs? Matt. 1.-6

4. “Do not give dogs what is sacred; do not throw your pearls to pigs. If you do, they may trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you to pieces.” Matt. 7.6

Explain what Jesus is trying to teach his disciples in this verse. In the light of this teaching, how do we look at the our Mission ministry, our Covid-19 Initiatives and your personal evangelism?
