1.	Have you ever imagined God seeing every sin you commit in the darkness, every dark corner in your heart, and every sinful thought in your mind and He sits in the holy temple as witness against you?
2.	Explain the term used in Micah 1:3 "the Lord will come down and tread upon the high places of the earth?"
3.	Have you ever imagined the wrath of God coming to all the people who sin against Him?
4.	Explain the transgression of Israel and Judah in Micah 1:5.
5.	Compare the 5 Kings; Soloman, Jeruboam, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah. What can you learn from each one of them?
6.	What is "High Place"? Should we have a "High Place" in us at the same time as we worship the One and Only God? What might be the consequences of having "High Place" in our life? Is there any "High Place" in your life today?
7.	What do you learn from Micah 2:12-13 through the book of Gospel? What is the only thing God requires from us? What should be your response to God?
