God of Love, the Faithful God | Romans 3:1-20 | Pr. Mark Tan

Read Romans 3:1-20

1. In what sense are Jews and Gentiles – or, we might say, religious and unreligious – are the same? (v9)
2. Some people are clearly less sinful than others. So, what do you think does the end of verse 9 mean?
3. In verses 10-18, Paul gives a long list of sin's effects on us. What are they? (there are at least seven)?
4. How do verses 18-20 sum up the whole of Paul's argument from Romans 1:18?
5. Why are verses 18-20 unpopular both inside and outside the church?
6. Why are verses 18-20 necessary to understand in order to believe the gospel?
7. Pray:
 - a. Use Question 3 to help you confess your sins before God.
 - b. Use Question 6 to help you thank God for the gospel.

No one will have any defense to make before God. But we can still be right with him, if we have faith in Jesus, who bore God's just wrath in our place.
