- 7. Why is it good news that God deals with us through a representative?
- 8. How would you use Romans 5 to encourage or challenge:
 - a) A Christian who is unsure that they are really loved and saved by God?
 - b) A Christian who is suffering greatly?
 - c) A non-believer who is worrying about dying?
