Life through the Spirit | Romans 8:1-17 | Pr. Mark Tan

1. In verse 1, what does the phrase “no condemnation” mean? Put Romans 8 v 1 into your own words.
2. What has the “Spirit of life” done for Paul, and for all Christians? And, why couldn’t the law produce the same results? (Rom 8:2-3)
3. Read Romans 8:5-13. How can we make sure we have our “minds set on what the Spirit desires”?
4. Read Romans 8:14-17. How does Paul describe the identity of those who are “led by the Spirit”?
5. What difference does it make to us that we know God as a Father, not simply as a Master?
6. “By him we cry, ‘Abba, Father’” (Rom8:15). How can this truth help to:
 - a. Comfort you?
 - b. Excite you?
 - c. Change how you pray?
7. Pray:
 - a. Praise God for the great truth that, in Christ, “there is now no condemnation.”
 - b. Thank God for the gift of the Spirit in your life.
 - c. Ask that God would help you in which you find difficult to “live in accordance with what the Spirit desires.”
