- 5) Read Luke 9:7-9: *Now Herod the tetrarch heard about all that was happening, and he was perplexed, because it was said by some that John had been raised from the dead, <sup>8</sup>by some that Elijah had appeared, and by others that one of the prophets of old had risen. <sup>9</sup>Herod said, “John I beheaded, but who is this about whom I hear such things?” And he sought to see him.*
- a. Why do you think that Herod was perplexed when he heard about Jesus' ministry?
- b. How do these passages relate to Luke 9:1-6?
