"God Speaks in the Storm" | Psalm 29 | Ong Hwee Soo

1. . Psalm 29:2 exhorts us to “worship the LORD in the splendour of holiness” (ESV)/”in the beauty of holiness” (NKJ)/”in holy array” (NASB). What is your view on wearing our ‘Sunday Best’ whenever we come to church for Worship Services? How would this thought help or hinder you when you are preparing to come to church for Worship?

2. In Psalm 29:3-9, “the voice of the LORD” is repeated 7 times. Discuss how God’s voice not only exhibits His immense power and majesty but speaks to us in ways to helps us understand His purposes? You may wish to refer to Psalm 19 and Romans 1:18-20 in your discussion. In what ways have God spoken to you in a stormy situation you may have encountered.

3. Discuss the quotation by Charles Spurgeon:

“Is not this noble Psalm to be sung in stormy weather?

Can you sing amid the thunder?

Will you sing when the last thunders are let loose, and Jesus judges the quick and the dead?”

4. Max Lucado's Prayer:

"My prayer is that you will find some word, some verse, or some thought that will convince you that God is very near.

I pray that as you read you will be reminded that the same voice that stilled the rage on the Sea of Galilee can still the storm in your world.

Be assured-He is closer than you have ever dreamed."

Share "some word, some verse or some thought" that have helped calm a storm you may have experienced.

5. In Psalm 29:10, David's reflection on the "flood" reminds us of what a staggering expression it was of God's power and justice. Discuss the following quotation by Dr Willeus Genaeren: "Even as in the days of the Flood, when He destroyed creation with His power but saved His own, so it is at any time that God's glory is expressed in the severity of judgment."
