1) Read 1 Peter 2:11-12

- a. 1 Peter 2:11a *Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles*. What is the meaning and the implication of this verse?
- b. What does it look like for someone to live like a sojourner (or foreigner) in this world?
- c. Does your way of life align with the description in these verses?

2) Read 1 Peter 2:13-17

- a. What are the commands and the expectations of the Apostle?
- b. What does “doing the will of God” mean in this context? (v15)
- c. How do we apply these exhortations in our current setting?

3) Read 1 Peter 2:18-23

- a. How does this verse apply to us in the modern world today?
- b. Why does it find favour with God if we are patient when we suffer unfairly?
- c. 1 Pet 2:21: "*For to this you have been called.*" What does this mean in this context? How does Jesus' suffering connect to our calling?
- d. Do you find any personal encouragement or comfort in these passages? (Share your reflections)
